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### Part A:

- To make efforts for raising funds by setting donor's club.
  - Based on this we have the following outcome achieved in the academic year.
  - ➤ The entire calendar was ready in the beginning of the academic year showing Schedule of examinations, Club activities, Sport and Cultural activities, HOD meetings, QAC and IQAC meetings, College committee meetings etc. We followed the calendar very strictly to the best possibility. Q. 1 Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution:

To achieve our goal, all the departments and committees put continuous efforts, by conducting various programmes in addition to its regular academic schedule as prescribed by the University.

Following are some such major programmes conducted in our college in the academic year 2005- 2006.

- National Seminar: The Department of Physics along with Marathi Vidnyan Parishad, Thane, had organized UGC sanctioned three days National seminar on "Einstein's Theories and Present Scenario".
- 2. **Workshop**: Three days workshop was conducted by Department of Statistics for Non Statisticians.
- 3. Through **Cultural association** various cultural activities, workshops and contests were organized. Our Students participated in various Inter Colligate Competitions.

- 4. Through Magazine Committee various competitions were held.

  At the end of the year we have published comprehensive magazine "Sanyuja".
- Various N.C.C. and N.S.S. Programmes like tree plantation, blood donation, participation as volunteers in Ganapati immersion programme, water conservation schemes along with NGO Hariyali were organized.
- 6. NATIONAL INTEGRATION CAMP (N.C.C.) was conducted in our college from 28<sup>th</sup> October 2005 to 8<sup>th</sup> November 2005. Boys and girls from NCC units, all over India, gathered in our college campus for cultural exchange between different states of India and to study cultural heritage of Maharashtra.
- 7. **Club activities** of various departments in which eminent speakers were invited. Seminars, Lecturers and Exhibitions were held.
- 8. **Campus interviews** were conducted for placement of Apex Ltd., Mayer Vitabiotics, ICICI Prudential, Tata AIG, Infosys and L& T Infotech. 'English Speaking course' was conducted by Employment cell.
- Yoga training classes were held free of cost, from July 2005 to October 2005 (every Fri & Sat) for 30 participants and from November 2005 to January 2006 (every Wed & Sat) for 25 participants.





Our management encourages us and extends full support for such activities. Hence for last three years we could conduct National level conferences. First in Zoology then next year in Botany, this year in Physics, next year it is the turn of Information Technology Department. On 24<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup> November 2006, we will be organizing a Conference on "Linux Thane 2006".

Our Mathematics and Statistics Departments are organizing a one-day seminar on "Financial Mathematics" on 26<sup>th</sup> August 2006.

We will also have interdepartmental workshop on "Refreshing Chemistry for Biology students" in the month of September 2006.

Our employment cell will organize Seminar on 'Career counseling' for students.

We will continue our healthy practices of preparing yearly calendar and follow it strictly, Yoga training, College-school complex activity. We will also proceed with N.S.S. & N.C.C. activities, which are useful to develop discipline, social awareness and sense of duty as a responsible citizen.

We will continue Science –square activity and activities of all clubs, which are helping our students to develop interest in the subject and in research. Also we will publish magazine, which is a good platform for the students to express their writing skills. Students participate in all these activities starting from planning till the execution of the programmes. This helps in overall personality development of students, also to know work ethics and to reduce the gap between students and teachers.

This year we received very good response on "Stress Management" programme. It is the need of the students, hence we will arrange more programmes to cater to the psychological need of our students.

Also we are planning to start "Class guide and Mentor system" by allocating 10-15 students per teacher so that teachers will be able to help to solve students difficulties and give them personal guidance. This will enable the teachers to counsel the students but before that the teachers will require proper training. Hence initially we are planning to have a workshop for teachers.

This is the era of fast food in which eatables consumed are satisfying hunger but are not having much nutritional status. Over and above in this hectic schedule of science faculty, students do not eat properly, they lag in knowing importance of nutritional diet, they have forgotten the motto 'Health is wealth', so we are planning to have lectures on this topic by experts. Also we have a plan to conduct health check-up camp for students as well as teachers.

Women cell of our college is planning to have a legal literacy workshop for girls.

Our web-net committee will update our web site.

As per the requirement of NAAC we have formed SPQAC (Students Participation in Quality Assurance Cell). We have taken two meetings of this committee in which it was decided that, the cell would arrange some programmes for students, and help in bridging the gap between students and teachers. The suggestions given by this cell regarding administration will also be considered.

Our management has started the expansion work. Already we have well equipped Information Technology Department, Mathematics and Statistics Department. This year there was an expansion and renovation of library, staff common room and ladies room.

Next year there will be an addition of an amphitheater, and the seminar room, examination room, record room and a well-set computer lab. Also our college office, Principal's chamber, Vice Principal's chamber will be renovated.

Our management is very supportive and ready to accept any new ideas. We believe in 'Healthy practices lead to Healthy Institute', hence we are trying to incorporate new ideas, new suggestions which help us in our progress. Always our efforts are to do better than the best.
