CRITERION I – CURRICULAR ASPECTS

1.1 – Curriculum Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 – Institution has the mechanism for well planned curriculum delivery and documentation. Explain in 500 words

• B.N. Bandodkar College of Science is affiliated to University of Mumbai, college follows the curricular designed and developed by curriculum/syllabus framing committee for UG and PG course. For PhD courses BNBCS Research Centre follows the syllabus of University of Mumbai. This includes delegations of Professor, Associate Professor, and Asst. Professor, bonafide students, alumni, NGOs and industrial expertise. Each subject has a separate BOS. Final design of the curriculum is reviewed and approved in Academic Council at University level. Academic council is a statutory body and is formed of the elected senate members at the university level. The revision of each individual syllabus is attempted every two (PG level) /three (UG level) year's cycles. All programs are designed on choice based credit system and evaluated on semester basis. Each semester is comprised of 90 teaching days. • Head of the Departments conducts meeting on the reopening day for the further planning of the academic year and distribution of syllabus paper wise and unit wise as per specialization after discussion with teachers. All the teachers prepare their teaching plans and execute them in semesters. Teaching plans includes ICT techniques, Origami, Model making, discussions, seminars etc. IQAC provides teaching plans and teachers dairy to all teachers and teachers fill the form accordingly and finish the syllabus on time. College administration also provides a well defined Schedule and time table annually for both UG and PG courses. The obsolete topics in the process are eliminated and most latest are introduced such as ICT, computation and its application in studies, use of internet in studies and conducting various events, soft skills, interdisciplinary courses, hands on training etc. Introduction of field projects in other subjects and research project for students seeking extra 02 credits apart from regular credits would provide an additional qualification to them. Field visits and excursions will enhance the practical experience of the subjects. Continuous perusal of short falls in the accomplishment of curricula to ensure maximum outcome is achieved through planning under supervision of IQAC, college development committee, evaluation system, feed-back system (students, alumni, parents and society) and managerial involvement. The academic enhancement is attained through the frequent organization of workshops, orientation programmes, colloquium, guest or popular lectures, counsellors, career guidance (Grab-it), seminars, industrial visits, excursions

etc. Students are encouraged to participate in scientific, patriotic and social activities through 'Avishkar' (University level science and research completion), NCC, WDC, NSS, (Yuvadin) and Student's Welfare festival. • Certificates courses are designed by senior teachers of the Department according to the demand of the society, which enhances the academic, professionals and entrepreneur skills. The certificate courses are passed at college development committee (CDC). In addition the students are availed choices of value added, certificate and diploma courses. The design foresees to inculcate utmost scientific knowledge in the pupils, leading to understanding and its sympathetic application for the benefit of the society.

Feedback Obtained
<p>i. A multilevel data management system has been implemented at BNBCS in order to collect data about Organizational performance and key operations. The data collected from committees and departments is reviewed, processed and comprehensively assessed by IQAC. ii. The internal audits are conducted annually. Considering internal audit remarks the various indices from the feedback of all the stakeholders, most effective measures, progress on strategic objectives and the action plan are designed. iii. Students are primary stakeholder of any education institute. BNBCS is the single faculty science college thus stakeholders are concerned with science stream. Teachers are continuously in contact with stakeholders during lectures and practical's. Overall college feedback in relation to administration, teaching and learning, infrastructure facility, cocurricular and extracurricular, college environment and other issues are received from stakeholders. Feedback data about curriculum collected from stakeholders (current Students, Teacher, Parents, Alumni, Society and/or Employers) on a 5 point scale. iv. Parents mentor meeting and through suggestion box, complain register, website, social media, email, direct communication etc. are taken into consideration to improve further and take appropriate quality measures. Questions related to teachers' abilities about command on subject, language, punctuality, explanation skills etc. are assessed. The data is collected, compiled and analyzed. v. Faculty members are asked to fill up self appraisal forms, where they can give their opinion for improvements. The performance of individual teacher is evaluated through self appraisal report and API forms. Teachers submit the selfappraisal reports with remarks from the head of the department. The assessment reports of nonteaching staff are collected from the heads. Also performance of faculty is evaluated by respective heads and by Principal. While Principal's performance is monitored by management. vi. Feedbacks received in the year 201819 from internal, midterm audit as well as IMC RBNQA and ISO are also considered for the improvements. SWOT analysis is an important component of the planning process. While preparing yearly report each department does SWOT analysis to plan for future. Before the measures are finalized, senior teachers and the peers do a final review in to meet the core competencies and the strategic challenges thus ensuring needs of stakeholders are mitigated. This feedback data thus collected is useful for the overall development of the Institution.</p>

Academic year begins with inaugural lecture by Principal regarding college culture, ethics, moral and human

values for all classes. VPM has defined Oath which is pledged by the students through the Principal at the time of inaugural address. BNBCS believes in 360 degree personality development of students, to achieve this goal college arranges different programs through the departmental club and different committees such as Mentor, NSS, NCC, WDC, DLLE Gandhi Vichar Manch, Jagar Janivancha, Cultural association, Sports activities, etc. to sensitize students on various issues. The academic deliberations on values like equality, cooperation, tolerance, patriotism, generosity, truth, justice and excellence are promoted during classroom sessions along with celebrating "Dina vishes". Constant efforts are made to inculcate ethical behaviour and right values. Hence mentor cell is introduced to the students from 2007. In the Mentor cell, teacher mentors were allotted about 1920 students. Mentors guide them to overcome in academic and personal difficulties they face. Mentors had to be regularly in touch with the allotted group of students required despite monthly meetings. Thus, the teachers are their academic guardians. This system works excellent where students open up and start sharing their difficulties with their respective mentor. Student progress and issues if any are discussed in meeting with Head of the Department and Principal. For certain issues if required the potential strategies are formulated and are resolved. The mentor emphasizes that the life values are engraved in the minds of the students to deal with caring their counter parts people in society and environment which will make them good citizen of the country with integrity and commitment. Further to enhance these activities the concept of Mentor System "Change attitude and behaviour" launched for Transformation and Personal Excellence for stake holders such as teachers, students and non teaching staff of the institute from the year 2017 and which is continued for current year. As it is ongoing process and a part of the project motivational sessions were conducted throughout the year to Train the Trainers.

2.5.2 – Reforms initiated on Continuous Internal Evaluation(CIE) system at the institutional level (250 words)

The evaluation, syllabus and examination norms are followed as per directives given by University of Mumbai. College has Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in all undergraduate and post graduate courses. Students are made aware of the evaluation process through the orientation lecture at the beginning of the year. Examination evaluation pattern semester wise for PG is 60:40. Isolated courses such as Biotechnology, Computer Science, Human Science, Interdisciplinary Science and Information Technology have internal assessment component in the form of class tests which consist of questions such as fill in the blanks, multiple choice questions, match the following, short answers and monitoring students in classes. However, at the institutional level, isolated courses along with other courses, evaluation is done on the basis of seminar, group discussion, questionnaires related to syllabus, quiz on syllabus topics, tutorials, assignments, projects, oral, library sessions and personal interaction etc. Progress report and attendance of individual student is presented in the Parent - Teacher meeting to get the feedback and evaluation of student progress. The continuous internal evaluation (CIE) allows the teachers to assess the students for tracking their progress and to identify slow and advanced learners. Remedial Classes and extra laboratory experiments are conducted for the slow learners, absentees on medical background and for the students who participate in extracurricular activities representing college. The meritorious students were explored to project based learning, through which they perform MiniResearch projects throughout the year and present it on National Science day, Exhibitions and Conferences.

2.5.3 – Academic calendar prepared and adhered for conduct of Examination and other related matters (250 words)

BNBCS plans the Academic Calendar of the Curricular, Cocurricular and Extracurricular activities and uploads it on web in the month of April for the next academic year. The adherence to the Calendar is monitored. The schedule of the external examination is declared by the university for the T.Y.B.Sc. and M.Sc. examination and is displayed on the student notice board. The examination committee prepares the time table for F.Y.B.Sc. and S.Y.B.Sc. in the framework provided by the university and is displayed on the student notice board. Heads of the department and Examination committee jointly prepare the time table For the practical examinations of F.Y.B.Sc and S.Y.B.Sc. Every teacher is assigned the subjects to be taught during the academic year. The teacher has a teaching plan and evaluation schedule of assigned subject. The type and schedule of internal evaluation for isolated subject is planned in consultation with the Head of the Department and Examination committee. The Head of the department compiles the academic plan submitted by the teachers and ensures that there is no overlapping of the activities in general and the CIE in particular at both the internal as well as the University level. The Academic calendar is then

forwarded to the IQAC to validate and verify. The stakeholders are aware of the CIE of every department in the college. The adjustment in dates is sometimes made subject to the examination schedule of the affiliating University. The students are informed accordingly through notices and announcements in the classroom well in advanced.

Library Advisory Committee meets to discuss the function, requirements, utilization of resources and other matter pertaining to the library. All the 4 libraries in the Campus are interconnected and functional with WebOPAC. The books can be issued from neighbouring colleges libraries by completing proper procedure of Inter Library Loan. External membership facility is available for society. Maintenance of the infrastructural facility along with classrooms, gymkhana, Ladies Common Room, Auditorium, Water cooler, Fire extinguisher, first aid box, Aqua guard, Air conditioners etc is taken care by Office administration. In case of any computer related problem an online link 10.1.1.250/software.htm is developed. For petty difficulties, departments entered their complaints into Complaint Register in office for further action. For scrap material, prior permission has to take from College Development Committee and then material is allowed to scrap. Use of Mobile Phone is allowed only for educational purpose whenever instructed by teachers. Students are not permitted in the laboratories without the presence of the faculty teacher. In BNBCS, auditorium of 180 capacities and on the campus 2 auditorium of 180 and 1 auditorium of 380 capacities is available for various programmes. Regular cleaning of classrooms, library, laboratories, college building, and washrooms etc is by housekeeping staff. For segregation of wastes, red dustbin for dry and blue dustbin for wet waste are kept in the departments and corridors. The Biocompost bin is functional in the college premises since last 10 years. Regular Pest control of building and its surrounding is done by college as well as TMC. Parking facility is available for teaching and nonteaching staff. Gymkhana is facilitating students and staff to make the play in sports ground and providing play kits. Varies games, cricket, volleyball, Basketball, Indoor game like T.T, carom and chess. Considering basic needs of female students, Sanitary napkin machine and Incinerator is available in Ladies Common Room. Medical facility is

available for any emergency treatment. For speedy communication, intercom facility is available in every department. Also Public announcement System is available for announcement of notices. Students can consult with the librarian any problems related to the library and its services. The librarian tries to settle them in their capacity otherwise forward them to the Principal of the college. A suggestion box is kept near the Office and in the library seeking valuable suggestions and recommendations from the all the users. The suggestions made by them are taken up and discussed in the IQAC meetings and healthy suggestions are implemented.

The college assures quality in academics and administration process by frequent internal audits, regular documentation and departmental committee presentations which are scrutinized by IQAC. The management has empowered the IQAC to take decisions related to curricular, co curricular and extracurricular activities. To improve the quality of educational provisions and administrative work the entire administration is decentralized. The college has 13 departmental heads and 52 committee coordinators pertaining to various themes. These department and committees meet the Plan as per the scheduled programmes. Decentralization ensures wider deliberations on the issues which are discussed in staff meetings and decision are taken with maximum acceptance. Hence, calendar is designed in the beginning of academic year which includes details of academic, administrative and extracurricular activities. Management level meetings of all Principals/Directors of various institutes take place on monthly or bimonthly basis, thereby keeping a tab on the management validation and verification of the VPM as well as the institutes at the individual level. In the meeting of management and Heads of all institutions, the strategic planning, decisions are taken and roadmap for the same is decided. In every meeting a review of past work is taken and future activities are discussed and planned. Principal is invited for meetings by Jt. Director (Govt.) and University of Mumbai whenever there are any changes in the rules and regulations. The staffs attend university meetings timely that tend to the various needs and changes with respect to the curriculum and the student centric activities. The Principal then explains and discuss the decisions taken in management meeting to the Departmental Heads. IQAC coordinator is the part of the meeting along with vice principal. The IQAC members are the primary Strategic

Planning group. Principal and IQAC coordinator discuss the decision of the management accordingly, supporting decisions are kept in CDC, for approval. In addition to this some college policies are decided in CDC meetings. Any new decision to be implemented is first discussed with Heads of departments, concerned coordinators accordingly programmes are modified and implemented taking into consideration all pros / cons. Vice Principal is appointed by the management in consultation with the Principal and he/she performs supporting role and acts as I/C Principal in absentia of the Principal. Social media and emails are used for the communication and discussion for day to day activities along with personal dialogues. For the overall growth of students, HODs conducts meeting with departmental staffs for the strategic planning in the said manner

PlanDoStudyActfeedbackimprovement. The Core competencies are reviewed by IQAC through internal and external audits, feedback forms and PTA meetings that are taken across the year. Principal conducts meeting with nonteaching and teaching staff at the beginning of the year and term end and also as per the situational demands. The meetings key agenda comprises of execution procedures and to update the routine work. Many activities pertaining to teaching, learning and research are covered during these meetings and planning processes. A Progressive institute is the one which abides by the time and hence at BNBCS, Principal, IQAC and HOD's make sure that the short and long term time horizons are well addressed.

Administration

Administrative information including important notices is regularly uploaded on the website as well as displayed on the students, general staff notice board and on attendance muster. The same displays on the screen for students and other stakeholders. All inwards such as policies, rules and regulations, circular related higher education are mailed to official mail Id of teachers, respective coordinators and nonteaching faculties. The college is connected through highspeed internet

of bandwidth 62 MBPS and WiFi campus. Fully automated office, biometric attendance for staff, computerized examination cell and online attendance, admissions and smartcard system in library. Students are informed important notices through Public Announcement System. College encourages administrative staff to maintain the data through the proper use of ICT.

Finance and Accounts

The institution prepares annual budgets for allocation of funds for effective use of available resources. The college budget is prepared taking into consideration the priorities that needs to be catered during the year. The College uses the SR software which is developed by the college management for transparent functioning of Finance and Accounts department of the college. The college conducts regular (monthly / quarterly) audit of books of accounts. The administrative staffs maintain the Books of Accounts properly which helps in auditing procedure to maintain the accuracy in financial transactions.

Student Admission and Support

College is continuously in touch with stakeholders through social media, suggestion box, complain register, website, email, telephonic and personal communication etc. to improve further and take more quality enhancement measures such as enrolment, examination, results, online feedback, request for certificates, issuing Icards. The student admission and administrative work is carried out digitally. Admission is given strictly on Merit basis under the norms of University of Mumbai and Government of Maharashtra. Payment of Fees can be made on instalment basis. Travel concession is available for students. Earn while Learn scheme is available for economically weaker students. College library provide book bank facility to low income group, meritorious and socially weaker students. Study material is available in Institutional Repository and can be accessible from anywhere. Attendance of the students is recorded in Digital Attendance System.
