Vidya Prasarak Mandal, Thane, (VPM) was founded in the year 1935. Its founding fathers led by Late. Dr. V. N. Bedekar, a medical practitioner, were the men of modest means imbibed with idealism and desire to serve the educational needs of the people of Thane. The depth and breadth of their vision is amply reflected in the objectives of the VPM as stated below.

- To provide the people residing in the Thane city and its vicinity, facilities for their intellectual, physical, scientific, social, cultural and professional education, to give publicity for the same, to establish and operate conducive factors for the above, e.g. parent-teachers association, stores for educational supplies, and thereby adding to the knowledge of the people.
- To emphasize the need for industrial knowledge and for the purpose of providing educational facilities for the same, to start and operate various undertakings such as industrial, educational institutes, Polytechnic, Engineering Colleges, etc.
- To co-operate with other public institutions on special occasions with a view to attaining the above mentioned purpose.

VPM's Academy of International Education and Research (AIER)

VPM's Academy of International Education and Research (AIER) was formally established in 2009 as an international wing of the Vidya Prasarak Mandal, Thane (VPMT). It has been undertaking a variety of activities as enumerated below.

- **1. Study Visits of British Teachers:** On the request of the League for the Exchange of Commonwealth Teachers (LECT) AIER hosted five educational tours of British teachers to India from 2003 to 2008. The visiting teachers were taken to schools both in rural as well as in urban areas to facilitate their interaction with Indian students and teachers.
- **2. Hosting Delegations from China:** AIER hosted the visits of two delegations from China. The first delegation, from China Association of Science and Technology (CAST), Beijing visited Thane in 2007 while the second delegation from Shanghai Association of Science and Technology (SAST) visited Thane in 2009.
- **3.** Cultural Exchange for Students from Kyoto Sangyo University, Japan: AIER hosted three visits of students pursing Asian Studies at the Kyoto Sangyo University at Kyoto in Japan in 2012,13 and 14. During these visits students are given guidance in communicative Hindi and English apart and yoga.
- **4. Educational Tours of Indian Teachers and Students:** AIER has been organizing educational tours of Indian teachers and students to UK since 2004. It also initiated conducting educational tours to Singapore since 2010. More than 130 practicing teachers and more than 70 students, both from school as well as college, have been benefited by this scheme.
- **5. Participation in International Competitions:** AIER has been taking a team of school students from Sau. A. K. Joshi English Medium School, Thane to participate in the China Adolescent Science and Technology Innovation Contest (CASTIC) since 2007. So far students have participated in eight CASTIC events held at various places in China.
- **6. International Conference and Workshops:** In order to celebrate the 900th birth anniversary of Bhaskaracharya an international conference **Bhaskara900** was organised at Thane from September 19 to 21, 2014. In addition conducted 65 workshops on Bhaskaracharya's Lilavati were conducted for the benefit of teaches and students.

The City of Singapore

Singapore, known as the Republic of Singapore, is an island country located in southeastern part of Asia. It is quite close to equator; the distance of the city from the equator being just 137 kilometres. The country's territory consists of the diamond-shaped main island, commonly referred to as Singapore Island and more than 60 significantly smaller islets. Singapore is separated from Malaysia by the Straights of Johar to the north, and from Riau island of Indonesia by the Singapore Straight to the south. The country is highly urbanised. In order to fulfil the demands of people the country's territory is being expanded through land reclamation continuously.


As per the records, the islands were settled in the second century AD. In the earlier period it was ruled by local empires. The island changed its face when a trading post of the East India Company was set up. Sir Stamford Raffles gave the city a modern look in 1819. Singapore became one of the British settlements in 1826. It was given independence in 1963 along with Malaysia. But it got separated from Malaysia just two years later. Since then Singapore has developed rapidly, earning recognition as one of the Four Asian Tigers.

The name Singapore is derived from its original Sanskrit name Sinhapur meaning the City of Lions. Nearly 5.5 million people live in the city of Singapore of which well over 2 million are foreignborn. While Singapore is diverse, ethnic Asians predominate: 75 percent of the population is Chinese, with significant minorities of Malay, Indians and Eurasians. There are four official languages: English, Malay, Mandarin, and Tamil. Multiculturalism is promoted in the country.

Singapore is one of nine countries with the top AAA rating from all Credit Rating Agencies and the only Asian country on the list. It is one of the world's major commercial hubs and the fourth-largest financial centre. Using its strategic position on the globe it has developed a good port system and now boasts of five busiest ports. Its globalised and diversified economy depends heavily on trade, especially manufacturing, which accounted for around 30 percent of Singapore's GDP in 2013. Singapore has the third highest per capita income in the world. It is placed at high position in international rankings with regard to education, healthcare and economic competitiveness.

Politically, Singapore is a multiparty democratic country. It is one of the five founding members of ASEAN (Association of South East Asian Nations). It also hosts the Secretariat of APEC (Asia Pacific Economic Cooperation). It is a member of the East Asia Summit, the Non-Aligned Movement and the Commonwealth of Nations.

Education system in Singapore

Education in the country of Singapore is mainly supported by the state. There are a few privately managed schools in the country. They are governed by the rules framed by the Ministry of Education (MOE), Republic of Singapore. The school term starts on January 2nd and ends on November 20. Then there is a six week of annual vacation. The school term is divided into two semesters: January 2 to May 29 and June 29 to November 20. In general the schools have 40 weeks of teaching per academic year.

School education is divided into two parts: Primary and secondary. Primary education comprises six years of compulsory education. It consists of four year foundation course and two years orientation course. Secondary school is for four years. It is categorised as Special, Express and Normal depending on the ability of the students. Those who wish to go to university for further education have to undergo two years of pre-university course often called as Senior Schools or Junior Colleges.

After six years of primary schooling students have to take Primary School Learning Examination (PSLE). The placement of student in secondary education depends on the performance in this examination. After completing secondary education students have to appear for O Level GCE (General Certificate Examination). Those who go to Junior college appear for A level GCE examinations.

Students from Singapore have performed well in international competitions. They ranked first in TIMSS (Trends in International Mathematics and Science Study). Their performance in PISA (Programme for International Student Assessment) has also been laudable. Singapore students have always performed well in Science as well as Mathematical Olympiads.

There are two main universities managed by the Ministry of Education. They are National University of Singapore (NUS) and National Technological University (NTU)). In addition, there are a few institutions and universities that are managed by the private bodies. Singapore Management University (SMU), Singapore Institute of Management (SIM), Singapore Institute of Technology (SIT) and Singapore University of Technology and Design (SUTD) are some of the private universities. Until the recent part a large number of students from Singapore used to go to foreign universities for higher studies. Now this number has decreased substantially. On the other hand, the number of foreign students enrolling in Singapore Universities in increasing gradually.

April 8, 2015 (Evening Session) Visit to Marina Bay

The first day evening is devoted to visiting a landmark place in Singapore called **Marina Bay.** Located in the southern part of the city it is a place of attraction for tourists. It is actually an extension of the adjacent Central Business District. In the 1970s, land reclamation was carried out at Marina Bay. In this process Telok Ayer Basin and Inner Roads were removed from the map. Singapore River now flows into the bay instead of directly into the sea. In 2008, Marina Barrage was built, converting the basin into a new downtown freshwater Marina Reservoir, providing water supply, flood control and a new lifestyle attraction. There are many places of attractions on the bay: 1. Merlion (the ikon of Singapore), 2. Marina Bay Sands (the hotel), 3. Garden on the bay (artificial garden) and 4. Singapore Flyer (claimed to be taller than London Eye).

April 9, 2015 (Forenoon Session) Visit to Juying Primary School

A visit is arranged to Juying Primary School located at 320 Jurong (East) 32, Singapore 609 476 (URL: www.juyingpri.moe.edu and Tel: +65-6561-8837). Principal Mrs. JaswantShroya has gladly agreed to host the visit. During this visit the participants will get an opportunity to interact with principals, her teachers and students. They will be able to observe the facilities in the school and witness teacher pupil interaction.

April 9, 2015 (Afternoon Session) Visit to National Institute of Education

National Institute of Education (NIE) is located in the green campus of National Technological University (NTU). It plays an important role in supplying teachers to the country. Apart from providing degrees like B. Ed. (Bachelor of Education) as well as M. Ed. (Master of Education) the institute has a sound programme for Ph. D. in education. It is recognised as one of the best educational institutions in the world. Dr. Yew Jin Lee Professor of Science Education at NIE has agreed to show around the institute.

April 10, 2015 (Forenoon Session) Visit to Logic Mills Skill Development Centre

LogicMills is a thinking school focused on teaching fundamental analytical skills to children from ages 4 to 16. Founded in 2004 by a group of Singapore Management University professors and other teaching professionals, LogicMills is an innovative company that believes in equipping children with the mental tools needed to independently discuss, question, and answer issues from all walks of life. LogicMills concentrates on five important skills: Basic Analytical Skills, 2. Advanced Reasoning Skills, 3. Language and Communication Skills, 4. Memory Techniques and 5. Exploration. Prof. Mark Nowick, Professor from Singapore Management University has gladly accepted to host the visit and provide information about various activities of LogicMills. It is located in Bugis Village, 155B Rochor Road, 188430, Singapore (Phone: +65 68832171, Fax: +65 68832118).

April 10, 2015 (Afternoon Session) Visit to Singapore Science Centre

With more than a thousand interactive exhibits spanning 14 galleries, SCC is an ideal space to inspire the next generation of scientists. There are fun activities that can be found at 20 permanent exhibitions such as the Ecogarden, which showcases a variety of plants, all growing naturally and receiving no special care. Defending Science exhibits the latest in surveillance, flight, armour and radar used in the battlefield, while Quirky illustrates how fun science can be with displays of unique innovations. Shows and demonstrations are scheduled daily and are designed to make learning exciting. One can witness a spectacular Fire Tornado Demonstration in safety, get up close with a giant hissing cockroach on your hand, or gaze into the stars at the observatory.

April 10, 2015 (Evening Session) Night Safari

A night safari arranged in Singapore is the world's first nocturnal zoo and is one of the most popular tourist attractions in Singapore. It was suggested in the 1980s by the former executive chairman of the Singapore Zoo, Dr Ong Swee Law. Constructed at a cost of S\$ 63 million, the Night Safari was officially opened on 26 May 1994 and occupies 35 hectares (86 acres) of secondary rainforest. Night Safari currently houses over 2,500 animals representing over 130 species, of which 38% are threatened species. The Night Safari is managed by Wildlife Reserves Singapore, and about 1.1 million visitors visit the safari per year.

April 11, 2015 (Forenoon Session) Visit to Singapore National Museum

The **National Museum of Singapore** is the oldest museum in the city. Its history dates back to 1849 when it was started as a section of a library at Singapore Institution. After several relocations, the Museum was brought to its present site at Stamford Road in 1887. The museum focuses on exhibits related to the history of Singapore. The Museum was named the *National Museum of Singapore* in 1965. The Museum underwent a three-and-a-half-year restoration and reopened on 2 December 2006, with the Singapore History Gallery opening on 8 December of the same year. The revamped National Museum was officially opened by former President of Singapore S R Nathan and Minister for Information, Communications and the Arts Lee Boon Yang on 7 December 2006.

April 11, 2015 (Afternoon Session) City Tour

This will be a privately guided tour that would begin from the hotel. It will have a drive around the Civic District past the Padang, the Cricket Club and the historic Parliament House, Supreme Court and City Hall. Next a stop at the Merlion Park for great views of Marina Bay and a picture-taking opportunity with The Merlion, Singapore's well-known tourism icon, a mythological creature that is part lion and part fish. The tour continues with a visit to the Thian Hock Keng Temple, one of the oldest Buddhist-Taoist temples on the island, before driving past Chinatown to a local handicraft centre. From there you proceed to the National Orchid Garden, located within the Singapore Botanic Gardens, which boasts of a sprawling display of 60,000 orchid plants comprising of 400 species and more than 2,000 hybrids.

April 11, 2015 (Evening Session) Discussion with Local People

Local persons will be invited to the hotel for discussion. It will be an informal interaction to know more about the country. The participants will be able to find out how such a small country could make progress in such a short time. They would also be able to explore how could they build a good social behaviour among local people. There would of course be various other issues of discussion.

April 12, 2015 (Whole Day) Visit to Sentosa Island

The island was named "Sentosa" in 1972, which means peace and tranquillity in Malay language. It must be noted that this word come from Sanskrit word *santosha*. The Sentosa Development Corporation was formed on 1 September 1972 to oversee the development of the island. In 1974 the Cable Car system was built. A series of attractions were subsequently opened for visitors including, Wax Museum, Musical Fountain, Underwater World, etc. The causeway bridge was opened in 1992 connecting Sentosa to the mainland. New Sentosa Express Service was made operational on 15 January 2007. In the area that was to be cleared for the construction of the resorts, over two hundred trees and plants were replanted elsewhere on the island to minimise negative environmental impact. In 2009, construction of a new foot bridge began. The island is, thus, well connected to the main island of Singapore. The participants will have a chance to spend the entire day at this artificially developed island.
